# 2019 President's Report

Gold Coast Cycling Club has faced some difficult challenges this year. Theft was a major concern in the early part of the year, with cash tin, bikes and motorbikes stolen. Later in the year came the floods, but thanks to an amazing bunch of people with a strong community spirit, we have come out okay. There was an outstanding number of clean-up volunteers who came to lend a helping hand after the floods. Every piece of salvageable equipment was cleaned with care and it is with great pride that I once again thank all those who helped out.



Councillor Peter Young has been able to secure funds for the Gold Coast Cycle Centre in Nerang, upgrading lighting for the velodrome and making repairs to the criterium circuit. Looking forward, we are still pushing towards a total resurfacing of the criterium circuit and even lighting it up!



Sunday club racing this year has seen steady numbers, while Wednesday Worlds has seen some growth, with an average participation of about 80 riders. Our final Wednesday World of 2019 had over 120 riders. The addition of live streaming the races has been extremely popular, enabling friends and family to enjoy a front row seat from the comfort of their own homes. Wednesday motor pacing has also been steady, until flooding damaged the track.

The junior tour once again took place in Nerang and participation numbers were good. This tour is vital in providing pathways for juniors to put themselves in a competitive environment to progress forward to state and national titles. As our junior program has seen enormous growth and the decision was made to form a junior sub-committee. This has been a positive addition and has taken some of the load off the steering committee.

The 26th Darren Smith Classic was held at the Hinze Dam precinct, and the circuit is arguably the toughest in the QCRS series. Participation was up on the previous year, however, we did not break even for this event. Looking forward, our objective is to seek a headline sponsor. The Club was then back at Hinze Dam and Runaway Bay to help conduct the Junior Road National Championships.

Last but not least, a huge thank you to our Management Committee. Without them we simply wouldn't function. If you are interested in joining the team, please feel free to contact the Management Committee. I look forward to an even stronger year in 2020!

# 2019 Coaches' Report

The Gold Coast Cycling Club offers junior cycling training for riders aged 7 to 17. These training lessons are primarily focused on getting the kids ready to race for road and track, covering fitness and bike handling skills. The main objective is for the kids to enjoy cycling with the older children, giving them support and



encouragement along way. The club is lucky enough to be able to host training sessions at the Nerang Cycling Centre, a fantastic facility with a variety of terrain. With short hills for climbing, fast downhill straights, and tight hook turns, the environment provides a varied, safe, traffic free place to train.

There was a significant lift in rider turnout at junior training during 2019. It was great to see so many kids on their bikes, enjoying this great sport. The increased participation levels helped draw additional coaching staff, with Nick and Todd joining the ranks. Malcolm has been assisted by Junior Coaches Etienne and Teddy, learning with his guidance.

In June 2019, the Juniors were off to Boonah Camp where they spent 2 days at The Outlook. The children enjoyed riding all types of terrain from open flat areas to short rollers and even up the Mt Alford climb, creating some great friendships along the way. All packs of riders had multiple support riders and support vehicles to ensure they were safe on the open road. It was noticeable after the camp how much this improved their cycling

The Gold Coast Junior Tour was also held in June 2019 and, with many fantastic sponsorships secured. This Tour was held at the Nerang Cycling Centre, comprised of 3 exciting events: a Prologue, Criterium and Road Race. Riders from several clubs put in their best efforts and had a great day out. These events were made possible by our amazing volunteers who did a wonderful job.

It was a busy year for all the juniors competing in racing. From local criterium races to State and National events there was never a quiet time in the calendar for the busy junior riders. Our riders travelled to Ipswich for State Road championships and their national titles were held here on the coast.

Coach Nick hosted some training sessions at both the Nerang Velodrome and the Anna Meares Velodrome to help the children fine tune their track skills and efforts. Our junior riders were fortunate enough to compete for both State and National track titles on the Anna Meares Velodrome in Brisbane. Our club junior riders returned with well-earned placings, and medals around their necks.



We regularly see fresh faces excited to attend junior training on Tuesdays and Thursday afternoons. There is also a Junior and Adult social ride on Saturday mornings. This year we introduced a Code of Conduct for all parents and participants to follow. This is to ensure everyone understands the Club's expectations while at the track.

Some Tuesdays see as many as 40 junior riders attending training. With this increase of interest in our club, the committee was able to secure a grant to purchase 10 new bikes for the children to train and race on. These bikes were purchased with the junior rider in mind to ensure that handlebars were modified and gearing all set at the junior standards.

The Club's aim for 2020 is to help our junior cyclists to become strong, confident capable riders. We endeavour to make the training enjoyable, building athletically capable children who have a passion for riding their bikes.

# 2019 Treasurer's Report

During 2019 the Gold Coast Cycling Club saw steady growth during a challenging year.

The club hosted the Junior Tour in June, a multi-stage race held at the Nerang Cycling Centre. The event was highly successful for the club with a profit of \$6,596. Revenue from the event totalled \$8,945, with \$4,000 coming from sponsorships, and the remaining \$4,945 entry fees. Costs relating to the event were minimal - \$2,349 for prizes, trophies, food and entertainment. Sponsorship played a crucial role in the financial success of this event.

The Gold Coast Cycling Club was again able to bring the annual Darren Smith Classic to Hinze Dam. On the July 28th, with SQL Water's kind permission the club was able to hold this iconic race. A generous \$5,000 donation from Cr Tozer and a \$2,000 donation from Coastal Services Group, made this event possible, providing the cycling community with the exciting, unique opportunity to race up the Hinze Dam wall.

Competitor participation was strong. Revenue from race entry fees totalled \$14,180. Costs related to hosting the event totalled \$24,196;

Costs exceeded race entry revenue by \$10,016. Cr Tozer's \$5,000 donation and Coastal Service Group's contribution the event resulted in a net loss for the club of \$3,016.

The Gold Coast Cycling Club Committee still feel that this is an event that is worth holding, which will be feasible with revised strategies regarding entry fees, sponsorship and entrant numbers, and by reducing costs.

The club's twilight racing series continued throughout the 2019 summer, with racing every Wednesday night. There was plenty of exciting racing during this series for the club, bringing in \$5,675. This is a decrease of \$1,196 compared to last year.

Regular weekend races were held throughout the year, at locations including the Arundel criterium circuit, Luke Harrop track and Gold Coast Cycle Centre. Unfortunately, we can no longer hold racing at Pimpama due to increased development in the area. Revenue from these events was \$6,624, a decrease of \$1,427 from the year prior. This is due to a lack of available venues throughout the year.

The cost to hire the tracks at Nerang and in Runaway Bay was \$7,527 for the year. This also covers the cost of hiring the track for the Junior Training and Wednesday night track events. The

club also pays an annual fee of \$800 to hire the cages to store the bikes and equipment at the Cycling Centre.

Track hire also enabled two other key revenue drivers for the club:

\$6,607 Junior Training - \$2567 increase on 2018 due to increased participation

\$2,105 Wednesday Night Track Training

Sales of club clothing totalled \$7,885, a decrease from the previous year's total of \$11,886.

During 2019 the Gold Coast Cycling Club was awarded a grant of \$7,500 to purchase new bikes for the junior program. 10 bikes of different sizes were purchased along with narrow handlebars to accommodate our growing junior riders. The Gold Coast Cycling Club also received funds from the Gold Coast City Council to help cover the losses that the club suffered due to a break and enter at the Nerang Cycling Centre. Multiple bikes and various equipment were able to be replaced by this generous donation from the council.

The club was proud to provide some financial support to many of our top junior athletes who attend national events on multiple occasions. Each athlete performed at their best, earning both podiums and experience.

At the end of 2019, the Gold Coast Cycling Club is in a sound financial position for the year to come. I present this financial report of the club for the 2019 calendar year and advise that its financial position is positive and the club is able to meet all financial obligations as and when they fall due.


