# 2020 President's Report

Without a doubt, 2020 will be etched in our memories forever.

Firstly, the global COVID-19 pandemic had a significant impact on our club's activities and the lives of our members, and it changed in several ways how we now operate. Yet at the same time, here in Queensland we were particularly sheltered from the harsh realities of widespread infection rates and long lockdowns. I personally am grateful for that good fortune and that as a community we have had the freedom to ride and race our bikes, and live without any excessive fear of contagion.

Additionally, 2020 saw the end of an era and beginning of a new, with the creation of AusCycling and the amalgamation of the road, track, mountain bike, cyclocross and BMX disciplines under one banner and one organisation. The move was supported wholeheartedly by the club's management committee and unanimously by the Cycling Queensland affiliated clubs, and we have started already to enjoy the benefits of a unified sport offering a fluid membership structure and a range of racing and development opportunities and efficiencies. That said, the Gold Coast Cycling Club's mission is 'to foster the sport of cycling, both road and track disciplines' and it is this that we continue to focus on. Club activities are built on two pillars, the first being racing and the second junior development.



## Racing and Performance

2020 started out like any other, with a New Year's Day Criterium and Daniel Bennett Memorial, held in Runaway Bay, followed by many of our Elite and U19 riders competing at the Australian Road National Championships in Buninyong and Ballarat. Emily Herfoss and Francesca Sewell each did exceptionally well, medaling in the Elite and U19 Women respectively. Others came very close. In January's Queensland Junior and Masters Track Championships, our club members did an awesome job, with State Champion titles from Ugs through to the upper end of the Masters. Three of our juniors were selected into the QLD Team. March saw the Australian Masters Track Championships held in Brisbane, with Mark Gibbs a standout performance, but unfortunately our juniors missed out on their Track Nationals, cancelled two days prior to commencement, due to COVID.

From March through to July, the club went into somewhat of a hiatus, with no live racing possible. However, members embraced E-Sport solutions such as Zwift, and Danny Matthews led the club in this environment, with social and training rides and races. The inaugural Cycling State of Origin series was also a hit, and despite QLD getting a hammering from NSW, Luke Richert, Simon Tyrell and Bree Wilson in particular waved the maroon flag high. Bree would go on to not only compete throughout the year in a range of high-level Zwift race series, including the Virtual National Road Series but also be selected to represent Australia in the first-ever UCI E-Sport World Championships, in which she helped compatriot Sarah Gigante to Silver. Well done, Bree!

In late July we were back racing in earnest at a local level and across South East Queensland. Our club members produced stunning performances in the QLD ITT Series, winning several categories, as too in the QLD State ITT Championships. This was great preparation for our older juniors, as we then hosted the Queensland Junior Road Championships across four venues here on the Gold Coast in August. This saw us unveil our new road course in Guanaba, which proved so successful that it was later chosen for the Australian Masters Road Championships in December. Thanks very much for Todd Smith for coming up with this course, and to the myriad volunteers who assisted in hosting what was a mammoth weekend of racing. I would also like to acknowledge the juniors

themselves, who performed outstandingly and topped the medal tally, as too the ever-dedicated Malcolm Rae who leads our Road program, and Etienne Richert who ably stepped up to coach the younger juniors and assist Mal.

Our next big event for the year was the Darren Smith Classic, which saw the culmination of the Queensland Classic Road Series for 2020. Once again held on the challenging Hinze Dam course, the road race drew record entry numbers and saw tremendous competition, and we were immensely proud of the number of club members who won the QCRS series overall, including Kane Richards and Danielle de Francesco in the Elite categories. For the first time, we expanded it to a 2-day competition, with criteriums held on the Saturday in Runaway Bay, and this too drew in the crowds and was a successful venture for the club. Many thanks go to Damien McFarlane and Cathy Reardon in particular for the success of the Darren Smith Classic, again also to the very many volunteers who made it happen.

December was packed with a massive block of National Road Series racing on the Tweed, in which many of our Elite members raced, followed by the Australian Masters Road Championships here on the Gold Coast and the 2021 Queensland Junior and Masters Track Championships in Brisbane. It was for this reason that we postponed our 2020 Awards until today, as there simply was not enough time to fit it all in. Our Elite riders continued to go from strength to strength, putting in a dominant and impressive performance in the NRS, our Masters took home many a medal and Top 5 performance from Road Nats, our handful of Track Masters all came home with State



bling, and our Juniors again topped the medal tally with an absolutely impressive set of performances. Our Head Track Coach Nick Hewes was duly appointed Head Coach of the QLD Junior Team, and a record 7 of our juniors selected to represent QLD at the 2021 Australian Junior Track Championships. On behalf of the club, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to Nick for all his work with our juniors in the track program.

### **Junior Development**

As previously mentioned, our junior development program saw some great successes in 2020. Yet it is not measured only in medals; rather it is about the development and sustainability of the sport, about introducing kids to road cycling and track cycling, nurturing their interest, developing their skills and fitness, and facilitating a safe and enjoyable, fun and supportive environment in which they can ride their bikes, and make new friendships. We want kids to enjoy riding and racing their bikes and be safe whilst doing so. At the same time, our coaching team is there to help progress the kids and take them to the next level, and the juniors are certainly stepping up and putting in the effort and training and developing real tenacity and resilience in the meantime.

Joe Cooper has recently joined the coaching team, and we look forward to seeing him having more to do with the development of our juniors in the coming year. Thank you, Joe, for giving back. Our junior program is an absolute cornerstone of the club, with training sessions often seeing between 30 and 40 children, and so for this reason it's important that we do have enough coaches on board. With their own personal work, study, family and personal training commitments, our coaches have constraints on their time and availability, and I would encourage more members to consider doing a coaching course and helping out with our juniors, and develop this next generation of cyclists.

### **Finance**

As you will see from the Treasurer's Report, the club is in a strong financial position, which is of course a good place to be.

Whilst we made a loss on the Darren Smith Classic in 2020, we remain committed to hosting a high quality road race in Darren's memory and for our members and the wider cycling community. In 2021, however, for financial and safety reasons, we will be unveiling a new road course. Stay tuned.

The management committee's prudent financial management has allowed us to invest in our juniors and their development, and this will continue to be a focus in 2021. However, we will also look to other opportunities to

invest in the membership, and of course, continue to build a 'war-chest' with which to enable criterium circuit lighting in the future.

The move to Buncheur for all training and racing registrations has allowed us to recoup more of the costs associated with holding junior training, and it is important to note that Buncheur was chosen not only for the functionalities it offered but for its cost-effectiveness as a solution. We are most grateful for the support we have been provided by Buncheur in introducing this to our operations.

### **New Club Uniform**

2020 saw the selection of a new club kit manufacturer and the introduction of a new kit ordering process. All club kit is now purchased online, with the club holding no stock, thereby reducing the financial burden on the club which previous uniform purchases entailed. After a lengthy selection process, JAKROO was chosen by the committee as the supplier of the new club kit and it is wonderful to see so many of our members now wearing it proudly at racing and training. All members are encouraged to purchase club kit; it builds club pride and club spirit, and a sense of belonging, and it is this that we would like to nurture.



### **Management Committee, Commissaires and Volunteers**

The past year has had its many challenges, as well as many successes. I would like to thank each and every one of our management committee members for all their assistance in running the club, with particular mention to Gavin Lenton, who served as Secretary for the 2020/2021 year. He did a sterling job behind the scenes and we wish him well in his new adventures in Brisbane.

Other outgoing members include Bree Wilson, Cameron Holling and Malcolm Rae. I thank them for all their service, particularly that of Mal, who continues

in his role as Head Coach of our junior road program. Dominique Verstreken also deserves a very special mention, having ably led the club for several years as President. In mid-2020 Dom stood down to focus his attention on other things, and we are grateful for his leadership, as well as his continued service to the club. Our Treasurer, Todd Smith has also done an excellent job managing the club's finances, and much more. Cathy Reardon has been a stalwart as our main commissaire, keeping Wednesday Worlds going each week. It was great to also have Peter Spencer and Andre Bondeson assisting with the commissairing load. Finally, thanks to Damien McFarlane for his continued service to the club, much of which is behind the scenes but invaluable.

In addition to our management committee and small commissaire pool, we have many others who volunteer and serve the club. Thank you so much to these people. Many hands make light work, as the saying goes. I can only encourage more members to get involved, however. There are many things we would like to achieve, that could be achieved, improvements and enhancements made, if we were to have more people to share the workload.

# 2020 Treasurer's Report

## Treasurer's Report 2020

During 2020 the Gold Coast Cycling Club activities were greatly impacted firstly by the flooding in early January that saw large sections of the velodrome destroyed, and then by the Covid-19 pandemic. Due to a number of restrictions imposed on our operations it has seen our club move to an online racing registration and payment portal.

In light of these events, our operations were hampered throughout the year, and unfortunately it resulted in the club not hosting the Gold Coast Junior Tour due to the Covid19 restrictions. However, the club was asked at short notice by Cycling Queensland to host the 2020 Queensland Junior State Road Titles. Due to the very short lead time which curtailed sponsorship opportunities, and the introduction of the new Maudland/Guana Road Course, this event was run at a small loss. Revenue from this event was \$10,429.70, with total outlays being \$11,746.77, for a loss of \$1,317.07. The major cost factors impacting this event was traffic control at \$6,813.40 and QLD Police at \$1,377.20, a number of tweaks to the course design have been identified that should see a significant reduction in traffic control costs should this course be used again for an open event. The success of this new road course was evidenced by AusCycling using the Guanaba/Maudsland Road course for the 2020 AusCycling Masters Road Nationals in December 2020.

Despite the Covid-19 pandemic, the Gold Coast Cycling Club was again able to bring the annual Darren Smith Classic to Hinze Dam, although at a point later in the year than normal, and for the first time we expanded the event to a 2-day race, with criteriums being held at Luke Harrop. On the 7th and 8th of November, with SQL Water's kind permission, the club was able to hold this iconic race. A generous \$5,000 donation from Cr Tozer helped make this event possible, providing the cycling community with the exciting, unique opportunity to race up the Hinze Dam wall.

Competitor participation was strong, with revenue from race entry fees and other sponsors totalling \$22,062, for a total of \$27,062, or a 28% increase on last year. Costs related to hosting the event were also up on the prior year and totalled \$31,143;

Costs exceeded race entry revenue by \$9,081. Thanks to Cr. Tozer's \$5,000 donation the event resulted in a net loss for the club of \$4,081.

The Gold Coast Cycling Club Committee feel that due to the high level of QPS and traffic management costs, and a number of safety issues that are difficult to mitigate, other course options are being investigated to ensure the ongoing viability of this event.

The club's twilight racing series continued throughout the 2020 summer, with racing every Wednesday night, although we were impacted by council works to the Nerang Criterium circuit at the start of 2020. There was plenty of exciting racing during this series for the club, bringing in \$5,581, which is on par with last year.

Regular weekend races were held throughout the year, at locations including the Arundel criterium circuit, the Luke Harrop circuit, the Gold Coast Cycle Centre and the Norwell Motorplex facility. Unfortunately, we can no longer hold racing at Arundel due to increased development in the area, we are investigating other potential criterium circuits for use to replace the Arundel course. Revenue from these events was \$5,126 a decrease of \$1,498 from the year prior. This is due to the impact of Covid-19 and lockdowns for a number of months during the year.

The cost to hire the tracks at Nerang, in Runaway Bay and the Norwell Motorplex was \$8946 for the year, including a prepayment for the Track Hire for the New Year's Day Criterium at Norwell Motorplex. This also covers the cost of hiring the track for the Junior Training and Wednesday night track events. The club also pays an annual fee of \$1,920 to hire the cages to store the bikes and equipment at the Cycling Centre, up significantly from \$800 in the prior year.



Track hire also enabled two other key revenue drivers for the club:

\$6,841 Junior Training - a result that was broadly in line with last year despite the Covid19 lockdown

\$1,316 Wednesday Night Track Training - a result which is down on prior years due to the Covid-19 lockdown.

Sales of club clothing totalled \$1,198, a decrease from the previous year as the club transitioned to a new model where the club kit is ordered directly from the supplier, resulting in the club not having to hold an inventory of kit.

During 2020, the Gold Coast Cycling Club was awarded a grant of \$15,924 by the QLD Government Community Gambling Fund to purchase a new electric motorbike, PA system and Projection System. Additionally, the club also received a number of other grants (\$3,000) in Covid19 restart grants to assist with the restarting of our activities from both the Gold Coast City Council and QLD State Government.

The club was proud to provide some financial support to many of our top junior athletes who attend national events on multiple occasions. Each athlete performed at their best, earning both podiums and experience.

**At the end of 2020, the Gold Coast Cycling Club, despite the challenges we faced during the 2020 year, is in a stronger financial position than the prior year and is in a sound financial position for the year to come.**

**I present this financial report of the club for the 2020 calendar year and advise that its financial position is positive, and the club is able to meet all financial obligations as and when they fall due.**

# 2020 Coaches' Report

Although a tough year for most people, our club and the juniors did their best to keep some form of normality where possible.

The juniors had a fantastic state track championship in January 2020 with our juniors taking a large medal haul across most categories. We had several of our juniors selected for the state track team in 2020: Noah Blannin, Luke Richert, Alex Hewes. They trained hard and unfortunately due to the global pandemic had their National Track championships cancelled just 2 days before they were due to go into camp. In spite of this set back the junior riders did what they could as did the rest of the world as we came to grips with what was happening around the world.



Our junior riders switched their focus toward the road season which thankfully was able to proceed although in a somewhat condensed schedule. Our junior riders performed exceptionally at the junior road state titles hosted by our club here on the Gold Coast. Luke Richert taking a clean sweep across all three events!

Unfortunately, they had their hopes and dreams disappointed once again with road nationals being postponed several times and eventually cancelled due to the pandemic. Not deterred by this they continued to train hard and compete in local races and showing some real strength in depth at the Darren Smith Classic where our riders once again proved their dominance across all age categories.

There are too many results to list here but I truly believe our club is at the forefront of junior development with ever increasing numbers of junior riders across all categories from U9 – U17's.

The past two years have seen combined road and track programs being developed for our young athletes with a pathway to state and national level for any athlete interested in being the best they can be. We know this development is having a positive impact on our young athletes with ever increasing numbers from our club making state team selection. We currently have 7 riders from our club selected for the Queensland Junior State track team of 20 riders. That's over a third of the squad from our club.

There's also a fantastic fun & social aspect with junior rides on Saturday mornings. It's promising to see the younger age groups growing in numbers with the current U11's & U13's having some of the largest numbers we have seen in many years. Many kids are also making the transition to racing which is great to see. None of this would be possible without our fantastic group of volunteers and parents.
