President's Report

We had a range of already well-established activities continue, and we trialled several new initiatives, and through this, were able to strengthen the club in spirit and in numbers.

Major Events

Condev Construction Junior Tour

June 2021 saw the traditional Gold Coast Junior Tour expanded to cover 5 stages over 2 days, and this was made possible by the very generous sponsorship of naming rights sponsor Condev Construction.

The weekend saw approximately 100 juniors enjoy some wonderful racing, with the U9s to U13s in Nerang and Runaway Bay, and the U15s and U17s spread across those same venues as well as Maudsland and Guanaba for their Prologue and Road Race respectively. It was a mammoth effort which came together with the help of a team of volunteers, with specific thanks to Race Director, Zane Cunningham, Asst. Race Director, Todd Smith, and our wonderful sponsors Condev Construction, JAKROO and GC Caravan for Hire.



Darren Smith Classic (QCRS)

Originally planned for August, but postponed until October due to yet another round of COVID disruption, the Darren Smith Classic saw us unveil our new Mt Alford road course in blazing heat. Again, held as a two-day event, with criteriums in Runaway Bay on the Saturday, and the road races on Sunday, we enjoyed record numbers. The feedback on the road course was very positive and

we look forward to returning in 2022. Massive thanks go to Race Director, Damien McFarlane, Asst. Race Director, Nathen Berghammer, Chief Commissaire, Cathy Reardon, as well as Brad Reardon. Naturally, there was a team of another 20-30 club members who banded together to make it happen on the day, and for all our volunteers we are grateful. The Darren Smith Classic also wouldn't have been possible without the generous support of our major sponsor, Bear Constructions, as well as Pure Sports Nutrition, TopLine Cycles and RC Pix.



New initiatives


With an enthusiastic management committee introducing new ideas, the past year saw us try many new things. These included adult road training with Jans Koerts during the winter, adult track training with Zane Cunnington over the spring and into the summer, as well as an Elite and a Masters team for the Queensland Road Team Series. Each proved very popular with those who participated, and the feedback was extremely positive, however, greater numbers and/or commitment by members would have been nice, in some instances. Expressions of interest were sought for Women's, Elite and Masters QRTS teams in 2022 but we were unable to reach the required numbers to field teams in the coming series, unfortunately.

Grants

Committee member, Lisa, applied for a number of grants and we were successful in over \$5000 worth of funding. We were able to update our first aid equipment with a new defibrillator. We received funding from the Nerang RSL to help with replacing tent frames after they were damaged in high winds and also received over \$3000 from GCCC for assistance with first aid and coaching accreditation.

Juniors

Once again, our racing juniors had a stellar year, winning the medal tallies at the QLD Junior Championships on both the Track and Road, as well as the Virtual National Junior Track Series. Outstanding performances from Noah Blannin (U17), Alex Hewes (U15) and Amelie Sanders (U15) ranked in the top 3 in Australia on 'virtual' performances.



Selected to represent Queensland in 2021 were:

U17M – Noah Blannin and Luke Richert; U17W – Akala Keeble;

U15M – Alex Hewes and James Matthews and U15W – Amelie

Sanders, Eden Sealey-Cunnington and Maddison Smith. This is testament to the strength of our junior development program, which continued to bring joy on the bike to so many kids over the course of the year, ably led by **Head Road Coach, Malcolm Rae, Head Track Coach, Nick Hewes, and assisted by coaches Etienne Richert (Road) and Zane Cunnington (Track)**. I would like to encourage more of our juniors to try their hand at racing.



Club Racing

All club racing this past year was held in Nerang and Runaway Bay, with Sunday racing once again slotted around the AusCycling Queensland calendar of events, and subject to rain and COVID disruptions which influenced our ability to get into any rhythm. However, our numbers in the second half of the year were very pleasing for weekend racing, and of course, our mid-week twilight criteriums continued to be a perennial hit. In 2021, we were delighted to have JAKROO come on board as naming rights sponsor, and we look forward to presenting our 2021/2022 JAKROO Wednesday Worlds series winners with their jerseys very soon.

The quality of our A Grade racing was enhanced by the successful introduction of an A2 Grade, which bolstered numbers in this top tier, as well as made for better racing and more manageable numbers in B Grade. We are grateful for the support of our members in implementing this change.

Gold Coast Cycle Centre

Within the 2021-2022 City of the Gold Coast budget, funding has been allocated to the continued upgrade of the Nerang criterium circuit, as well as the installation of lighting around the lower (600m) circuit. Whilst these works have not yet been undertaken, we are very grateful for the support of Council in investing in the continued maintenance and upgrade of the facilities in Nerang, and we look forward to being able to race and train at night on the lower circuit within the coming year.



Committee

I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the Management Committee for all their efforts over the course of the year, as well as to our club commissaires, coaches and volunteers. Without this amazing group of people, we wouldn't have been able to implement so many things and run so many races and training sessions, all to further the sports of road and track cycling. In doing so, we have also managed to build community, and that is what it's all about.

Thank you, Todd Smith (Treasurer), Caitlin Leach (Secretary), Lisa Baxter, Zane Cunnington, Simon Dickson, Tim Hutch, Damien McFarlane, Luke Symons, and Dom Verstreken.

Finally, I would like to thank the membership for all their support over my time as President, and before that as Secretary. After 8 years on the management committee, I am stepping down, and I am honoured to have had the opportunity to serve.

Treasurer's Report



During 2021 the Gold Coast Cycling Club activities continued to be impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic with various lockdowns and restrictions playing havoc with our racing season. However, despite all these challenges the club is in a strong financial position.

In 2021, we successfully managed to hold both the Gold Coast Junior Tour and the Darren Smith Classic. In addition to this the club also entered an Elite and Masters team in the Queensland Road Teams Series.

Thanks to the support of **Condev**, as title sponsor for the Gold Coast Junior Tour, we were able to run a two

day, five stage tour including a road race and time trial on the Guanaba Courses. Unfortunately, Covid19 impacts reduced our interstate contingent of riders. Entry fees for this event totalled \$2,802.05, with total outlays net of sponsorship being \$5,573.32, for a loss of \$2,771.72. The major cost factors impacting this event was traffic control (cost of which was covered by our wonderful sponsors **Condev**), QLD Police at \$1,222.40 and Trophies at \$1,455.00. A number of tweaks to the course design have been identified that should see a significant reduction in traffic control costs for 2022.



Despite the Covid-19 pandemic, the Gold Coast Cycling Club was again able to bring the annual Darren Smith Classic, albeit at a later date, to the new Mt Alford course. Competitor participation was strong, with revenue from race entry fees and other sponsors totalling \$21,171 net of costs from Auscycling. The costs related to hosting the event were down on the prior year due to the change of course and totalled \$19,590;

\$8,775 Traffic Control

\$6,810 Prize Money

This year the Darren Smith Classic was able to contribute \$1,581 towards the club account.

In addition to our two major events, the club also entered two teams in the Queensland Road Team Series, the cost of doing so amounted to \$8,846. Whilst the teams both performed well throughout the series, due to the interest levels of our members, the club has decided not to pursue this opportunity again in 2022.



The club's twilight racing series continued throughout the 2021 summer, with racing every Wednesday night, however, we were impacted greatly by Covid lockdowns and adverse

weather. There was plenty of exciting racing during this series for the club, bringing in \$3,170, which is down on last year, however the current summer series is tracking well.



Regular weekend races were held throughout the year, at locations including the Arundel criterium circuit, the Luke Harrop circuit, and the Gold Coast Cycle Centre (Nerang). Revenue from these events was \$3,746.

The cost to hire the venues at Nerang, Runaway Bay, Norwell Motorplex and AMV was \$13,286 for the year. This also covers the cost of hiring the track for the Junior Training and Wednesday night track events. The club also pays an annual fee of \$1,920 to hire the cages to store the bikes and equipment at the Gold Coast Cycling Centre.

Track hire also enabled two other key revenue drivers for the club:

\$6,872 Junior Training - a result that was broadly in line with last year despite the Covid19 lockdown


\$3,173 Wednesday Night Track Training - a result which is up on prior years.

In light of these events, our operations were hampered throughout the year.

At the end of 2021, the Gold Coast Cycling Club Inc., despite the challenges we faced during the 2021 year, is in a strong financial position and is in a sound financial position for the year to come.

I present this financial report of the Gold Coast Cycling Club Inc. for the 2021 calendar year and advise that its financial position is positive, and the club is able to meet all financial obligations as and when they fall due.

Coaches' Report



The 2021 season was another great season for our GCCC Juniors!

We had great representation across all state level junior events and as many interstate events that we could get to given the restrictions we all faced with COVID.

Our Juniors dominated the QLD track state championships, not only taking most of the titles but we also had 7 of our juniors make selection for the QLD state track team, our club made up over 1/3rd of the team. A fantastic achievement, unfortunately due to COVID our juniors hopes of a national track champs were once again dashed as the state went back into lock down, twice, just as the event was about to take place.

In addition to this, the NJTS (National Junior track series) still went ahead but became a virtual series with each state competing on their own tracks with all timing going through a computer program to allow for different conditions in the different venues. We had great representation at this series winning the U15M and high placings overall in the other categories.


Not deterred by this disappointment, our juniors took to the road where our juniors once again dominated in all of the junior tours in SE QLD. Kicking off with our own Gold Coast Junior Tour, as well as further afield with the Goulburn Junior tour and the Port Macquarie Junior Tour.

Our own GCCC Junior Tour took on a larger format thanks with some fantastic support from our member volunteers as well as our event sponsor CONDEV Cares and this event just wouldn't have been possible without their support. The GCCC Junior Tour was one of the best in the country last year in spite of all the COVID restrictions.



This took us up to the junior road state championships held in Bundaberg, once again our club had a huge presence at the event with many of our junior families making the trek to Bundaberg, where they didn't disappoint!

Once again, we had 6 riders from our club make selection for the QLD state road team!



And once again due to COVID their National championships were postponed and eventually cancelled.

One of our top Juniors has departed the ranks and moved into U19's for the 2022 season but his achievements as an U17 in 2021 didn't go unnoticed. A special congratulation to Noah Blannin who made selection into the QAS.

Our juniors have displayed amazing resilience and perseverance throughout this past year. We have a great group of young athletes but also a fantastic group of parents providing the much-needed support. Having travelled the country with these juniors and been involved with the State team our club is very much at the forefront of Junior development, not just here in SE QLD but nationally too.

The future of the sport is with these juniors and indeed with those to follow, it's essential we bring new kids through for the future of the sport. I believe at GCCC we have a great program for juniors with some

very dedicated people assisting with this, however it is vital that we not only bring new kids into the sport but also have the support group of new coaches and mentors to assist with their development.


