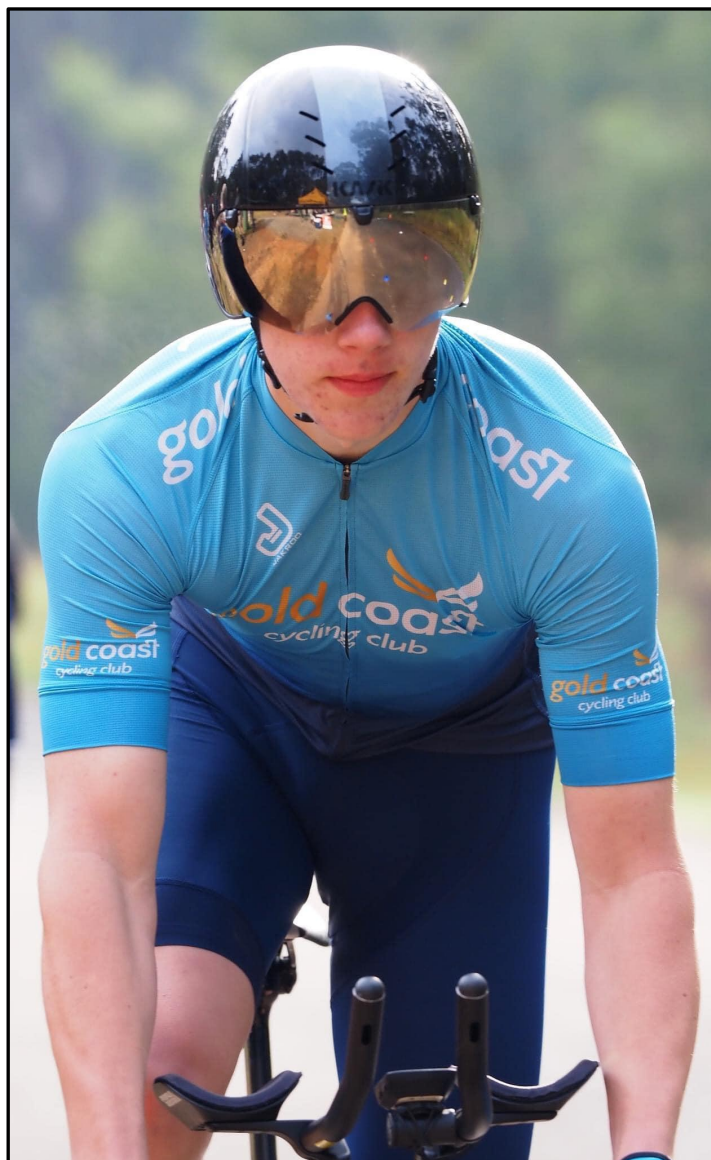

Gold Coast Junior Tour

Once again the Gold Coast Junior Tour was run in June and had 5 stages run over 2 days, The weekend saw approximately 100 juniors enjoy some wonderful racing, with the U9s to U13s in Nerang and Runaway Bay, and the U15s and U17s spread across those same venues as well as Maudsland and



Guanaba for their Prologue and Road Race respectively. Being the second year of this format, the tour went off without a hitch thanks to the team of volunteers. Huge congratulations go to Race Director, Zane Cunnington, Asst. Race Director, Todd Smith, and Race Secretary, Nanette Richert on another wonderful event. The countless hours these three spent to make this event happen is why this race is regarded as one of the best junior tours on the calendar. Darren Smith Classic (QCRS)

Back to our original slot in August, the Darren Smith Classic was once again held as a two-day event, with criteriums in Runaway Bay on the Saturday, and the road races on Sunday, at Mt Alford. After some discussion, a few adjustments were made to grades and length of races for the Sunday and this produced some great racing on the day with all races producing worthy winners. This race comes together because of our Race Director, Damien McFarlane - the work he puts into this event goes above and beyond and I am lucky to have his expertise and passion for this race. Thanks also goes to Assistant Director, Nathan Berghammer who was out early setting up the course with our team of volunteers who make it happen on the day. Without our volunteers the racing doesn't happen, so I am grateful for all the help that was given on both days. This year we welcomed a Major Sponsor in **Choice Homes** and we are thankful for their ongoing support. We also thank our other sponsors including **Googleman**, **Pure Sports Nutrition**, **Hutch Engineering Surveys** and **Topline Cycles Nerang**.

New Initiatives

2022 saw the introduction of the Monday night **Time Trial** and what a success it has been. Simon Dickson has been the driving force of this event and his passion for it has seen it grow from a few riders to 10 – 15 regulars who like to test themselves against the clock. With a few races thrown in for bragging rights and a handicap system introduced to even the playing field, we look forward to keeping this rolling into 2023 and beyond.



Another short-lived initiative was the combined track sessions with Hamilton and Ipswich at Anna Meares Velodrome. Due to the destruction of the velodrome at Nerang, an opportunity was put to us to hire AMV and have sessions with the other clubs. This provided track time for our trackies and an opportunity for new riders to come and try after passing their accreditation.



2022 also saw the introduction of our **Bright Trip**, a week spent in Victoria's renowned high country, cycling some of the area's scenic climbs and being led by Peter Spencer who knows the area like the back of his hand. A brave contingent ventured down in mid-October and were met with some great conditions considering the flooding that was taking place in the surrounding areas. Pete's local knowledge soon had everyone enjoying both the riding and the coffee stops as well. From all reports, the trip was a great success and we will be looking to run the same trip again in 2023 so keep an eye out for details on our social pages.

Club Racing

Club racing was once again held year-round between Nerang and Runaway Bay and although the early season was disrupted by the weather the end of the year finished strongly with every **JAKROO Wednesday World** race being able to be raced successfully. After continuing with A2 till the end of the



21/22 Wednesday World season it was decided by the committee to go back to A-E grades, not much difference bar a name change and the racing was great quality. A small grace period was given at the start of the 22/23 season and once points were on the line the grades were decided. All bar one grade was to be decided on the last points race of the season, so this made for some great attacking racing.

The inclusion of **Just Ride Nerang/ Choice Homes/Jans Koerts Training** most combative prize also proved successful as multiple riders received the voucher based on their attacking hanging around after Wednesday Worlds at Nerang for a well-earned **Madocke Beer**. A good time to brag about your win or lament the one that got away. A massive thanks to all the volunteers who gave up their time to man the Mountain Bike cross overs at Nerang and the S bends at Runaway Bay. Without your help we wouldn't be able to run our races safely.

I would like to congratulate every rider that represents the Gold Coast Cycling Club at any race or ride they enter. I believe we have a great culture of racing hard but showing great sportsmanship to our fellow competitors on the racetrack as well. I have seen our track riders being great role models to the younger trackies, I have seen us congratulate riders from other clubs when they do well at our club racing and I believe we have a friendly reputation in the south east cycling community.



Juniors

2022 saw another successful year for our junior riders with many of them representing the club so well in so many events throughout the year. Great results were achieved on both road and track including state and national titles. Due to the dedication of the kids, their parents and their coaches a few members were also rewarded with representative honours and once again they all made us proud watching them do their stuff.

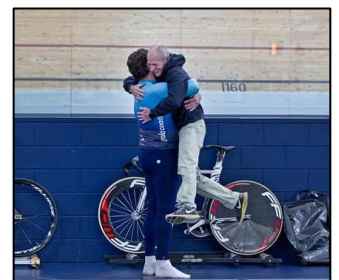

Treasurer's Report

During 2022, the Gold Coast Cycling Club activities continued to build on the momentum that was occurring as we came out of the Covid-19 pandemic. This rebound to growth saw the club finish the year in a strong financial position.

In 2022, we successfully managed to hold both the Gold Coast Junior Tour and the Darren Smith Classic.

Thanks to the support of **A & N Electrical, SEQ Enviro Services and GC Caravan for Hire**, as major sponsors for the Gold Coast Junior Tour, we were able to run a two day, five stage tour including a road race and time trial on the Guanaba Courses. Entry fees for this event totalled \$6,126.20, with sponsors contributing an additional \$7,000, total outlays \$12,282.19, for a profit of \$844.01. The major cost factors impacting this event was traffic control \$6,715.55, QLD Police at \$1,256 and Trophies at \$1,455.00. Due to a number of additional policies implemented by GCCC, the 2023 Junior Tour will revert back to an event held over two days solely at Nerang and Luke Harrop, with no on road component.



The Gold Coast Cycling Club was again able to promote the annual Darren Smith Classic thanks to the generous support of the event's title sponsor, **Choice Homes**, for a second time at the Mt Alford course. Competitor participation was down on the previous year, with revenue from race entry fees and other sponsors totalling \$19,124.50 net of costs from AusCycling. The costs related to hosting the event were in line with the prior year and totalled \$19,659.25;

\$9,558 Traffic Control
\$7,000 Prize Money

This year the Darren Smith Classic resulted in a small loss of \$534.75

The club's twilight racing series continued throughout the 2021 and 2022 summer, with racing every Wednesday night. There was plenty of exciting racing during this series for the club, bringing in \$4,339, net of prizemoney which is up on last year.

Regular weekend races were held throughout the year, at locations including the Luke Harrop circuit and the Gold Coast Cycle Centre (Nerang). Revenue from these events was \$6,109.16.

The cost to hire the venues at Nerang, Runaway Bay, and AMV was \$7,722 for the year. This also covers the cost of hiring the track for the Junior Training and Wednesday night track events. The club also pays an annual fee of \$2,086 to hire the cages to store the bikes and equipment at the Gold Coast Cycling Centre.

Track hire also enabled other key revenue drivers for the club:

\$4,184 Junior Training - this result is down on prior years.



Unfortunately, due to another flood event, the Velodrome was out of action again for a significant period of time, which reduced the club's ability to conduct the 100 lap moto training and other track events.

In light of these events, our operations were hampered throughout the year, however, the club was able to generate a profit of \$1,626.58 for the year.



At the end of 2022, the Gold Coast Cycling Club Inc., despite the challenges we faced during the 2021 year, is in a strong financial position and is in a sound financial position for the year to come.

I present this financial report of the Gold Coast Cycling Club Inc. for the 2022 calendar year and advise that its financial position is positive, and the club is able to meet all financial obligations as and when they fall due.

Coaches' Report

Towards the end of 2022 Coach Mal decided to take some well-earned time off from coaching. Coach Mal has been the major force behind the success of the Gold Coast Cycling Club in the junior ranks and we hope to continue to develop young athletes who enjoy their cycling as much as he did. Thankfully Coach Zane was able to step in and kept the junior road sessions running rather than have a gap. Zane also was integral in ensuring Geoff and Simon would be capable of continuing the Junior program when Zane's focus changed for track season.



Thanks must go to Lisa Baxter who had managed to secure the club a grant, to be used to fund the training of some more coaches. Coach's Geoff and Simon were the first to complete their certification and then stepped up to continue the road coaching program.

In the middle of the year the club partnered with Jans Koerts to deliver some adult coaching sessions, which showed there is a need and want for the club to deliver training sessions for its adult members.



The loss of the velodrome prompted Coach Simon to develop the Time Trial Training program at Luke Harrop on a Monday afternoon. It began very simply with riders using their bike computer to measure their time and distance, and a phone clock releasing riders in intervals. Over time Simon was able to setup a timing rig utilising RFID chips and timing software to evolve the session in a fully electronically timed race simulation, with a proper countdown clock displaying the rider's name.

We look forward to evolving the coaching program to attract more juniors, as well as provide a much-needed program for adults to train. into the coaching and training programs. The long-term aim is to setup a mentoring program, as well as a more defined pathway for members to become coaches.



The club's junior riders continue to perform amazingly throughout the 2022 season, which is a testament to work Coach Mal has done over the years. While the results are many and impressive, it is also the riders that have not achieved results that make the training worth doing, they all put in huge efforts and continually improve their riding and make great friends that they can ride with.

A number of our junior riders have been taking part in club racing, particularly the JAKROO Wednesday Worlds series, without the numbers to run separate junior divisions they have been racing in the adult A-E grades and really rising to the challenge. It's also worth mentioning that the adult racers have been very accommodating to the junior riders and it's great to see this in club competition.



A large contingent of riders that made the epic journey up to Cairns for the State Road Championships, and the Gold Coast kids shone like they always do, with plenty of podium results throughout the age groups. Such a journey requires a massive amount of dedication from the parents of those junior riders, the club has many amazing parents that enable their children to experience racing all over the country. It's a pleasure to have such amazing people in our club.

The club now holds 4 training/coaching sessions each week. With Time Trial Training on a Monday, Junior Coaching on a Tuesday, 100 Track Laps on a

Thursday, and all age coaching on a Thursday.

We are looking forward to another fantastic year of Junior racing in 2023!


