Major Events

Gold Coast Junior Tour

This year, the Gold Coast Junior Tour was run in June and had 5 stages run over 2 days. The weekend saw approximately 100 juniors enjoy some wonderful racing between Nerang and Runaway Bay. Unfortunately, the Guanaba course was missing from this year's tour but that didn't stop the competitive spirit of the juniors as they lit up the Nerang track with a prologue, setting some cracking times. The hills of the Nerang course made for a punishing road race as well. It was then on to Runaway Bay for the time trials and some fast-paced criteriums.

I would like to thank our Race Director, Nanette Richert, who put in a huge amount of time and experience into running the event and making it a success again – this is on top of the day to day commissairing that Nanette undertakes for road and track throughout the entire year. Also, a thank you to the other Commissaires and volunteers who make this event so enjoyable for the kids. This is the reason we have kids coming from all over the country to our tour. Thanks also to JAKROO for the winner's jersey - something the kids also look forward to winning.



Darren Smith Classic (QCRS)

A switch to an early August date to avoid overloading the race calendar was met with great enthusiasm as people were just keen to race. The DSC was once again held as a two-day event, with criteriums in Runaway Bay on the Saturday, and the road races on Sunday, at Mt Alford. Numbers were a little down in the criteriums, but we have put this down to the fact that the road race is challenging, and riders

are keeping fresh for Sunday. Thank you to our Race Director, Damien McFarline, and our small army of volunteers who contribute so much and without whom the racing doesn't happen - so I am grateful for all the help that was given on both days. Thanks again to our Major Sponsor in **Choice Homes** - we are grateful for your ongoing support. We also thank our other sponsors including Pure Sports Nutrition and Hutch Engineering Surveys. 2024 marks the 30th running of the Darren Smith Classic and planning had already started as we were driving away from Mt Alford on the Sunday last year.

Time Trials

Monday nights were the place to be to get your time trial fix and this event has gone from strength to strength. Due to the tireless work from Simon Dickson, our timing guru, many of our members were able to test themselves against the clock and achieve several PB's throughout the year. Handicaps were brought in to even



the playing field and this produced different winners throughout the year. A TT weekend between 3 clubs was the brainchild of Simon and his thinking was we would get around 30 riders at each track. He was pleasantly surprised when the numbers far exceeded expectations to the point Sunday was sold out. Lessons were learnt and planning is already under way for the next TT Weekend.

2023 was another successful year for our junior riders with so many of them representing the club in their club kits at many events throughout the year. Brilliant results were achieved on both road and track including state and national titles and they all seemed to do it with a smile on their faces. 

Treasurer's Report

During 2023, the Gold Coast Cycling Club activities continued to build on the momentum that was occurring as we came out of the Covid-19 pandemic This rebound to growth saw the club finish the year in a strong financial position.



In 2023, we successfully managed to hold both the Gold Coast Junior Tour and the Darren Smith Classic.

Due to an ever increasing burden place upon the club by Council, a decision was made for the Gold Coast Junior Tour to return to a two day format located at the Nerang and Luke Harrop Facilities, with a five stage tour. Entry fees for this event totalled \$2,764.50, total outlays of \$2,697.74, for a profit of \$66.76. The major cost factors impacting this event trophies at \$1,455.00.

The Gold Coast Cycling Club was again able to promote the annual Darren Smith Classic thanks to the generous support of the event's title sponsor, **Choice Homes**, for a third time at the Mt Alford course. Competitor participation was down on the previous year, with revenue from race entry fees and other sponsors totalling \$22,755.37 net of costs from AusCycling. The costs related to hosting the event did increase on prior years and totalled \$21,262.12.

\$9,493.25 Traffic Control \$7,725.00 Prize Money

This year the Darren Smith Classic resulted in a small profit of \$1,493.25

The club's twilight racing series continued throughout the 2022 and 2023 summer, with racing every Wednesday night. There was plenty of exciting racing during this series for the club, bringing in \$8,023.23, net of prizemoney which is well up on last year.

Regular weekend races were held throughout the year, at locations including the Luke Harrop circuit and the Gold Coast Cycle Centre (Nerang). Revenue from these events was \$1,680.39.

The cost to hire the venues at Nerang, Runaway Bay, and AMV was \$6,392 for the year. This also covers the cost of hiring the track for the Junior Training and Wednesday night track events. The club also pays an annual fee of \$2,456 to hire the cages to store the bikes and equipment at the Gold Coast Cycling Centre.

Track hire also enabled other key revenue drivers for the club:

\$ 6,751.14 Junior Training and Wednesday Track training - this result is up on prior years.

In light of these events, our operations the club was able to generate a profit of \$13,203.66 for the year.

At the end of 2023, the Gold Coast Cycling Club Inc., despite the challenges we faced during the 2022 year, is in a strong financial position and is in a sound financial position for the year to come.



I present this financial report of the Gold Coast Cycling Club Inc. for the 2023 calendar year and advise that its financial position is positive, and the club is able to meet all financial obligations as and when they fall due.

Coaches' Report

Junior training has continued Tuesdays and Thursdays, the club has succeeded in winning some grants and sponsorship to make both sessions FREE, as well pay for the training of more coaches. This year Geoff Frost and Simon Dickson handled the majority of the Tuesday and Thursday sessions, ensuring our newer riders were able to get comfortable training on their bicycles, and challenging our more experienced juniors to keep them learning new skills and improving their abilities.

Jans Koerts ran Interval Training Sessions on a Wednesday afternoon (outside the Wednesday Worlds season). We look forward to having more coaches bringing a wide variety of skills to the sessions so both juniors and senior riders can improve their riding and racing abilities.

The Monday Time Trial Training sessions have continued under the eye of coach Simon, we see our members continue to to improve against the clock. With 18 months of sessions run, 2024 is expected to show that the Gold Coast Cycling Club has a depth of time trialling talent.

A number of our junior riders have been taking part in club racing, particularly the JAKROO Wednesday Worlds series, racing in the adult A-E grades and showing they are a force to be reckoned with. It's fantastic that we are able to give our riders solid opportunities to race, and it's wonderful to see them out there competing with our senior riders, and that all riders give each other the respect required to make racing fun.

Our juniors once again showed they have what it takes, with a number of members making the state teams and competing at Nationals in both Track and Road, as well as the Junior Tours and Carnivals. It's a joy to see the younger generation cheer on their club mates and encourage each other to have a go.

We are looking forward to another fantastic year of coaching and training in 2024!
